## Description

Janke's drawings of machines are partly based on developments of his time, which he functionally extended to new application areas, also for the context of the Hubertusburger Clinic-Everyday.

The concrete functionality flows here, however, with the utopian dimension of his work and his vision of Raumelektrizität together.

Beyond that, Janke's work also implicitly conveys the recognition of his realities through the dimension of the aesthetic. This question of „Design“ brings together the different fields of his artistic research and makes the utopian horizon visible, which also goes beyond the functional here.
